Myron Evans holds the “world record” for the number of prestigious Fellowships won in open international competition, a record never likely to be broken. Gareth Evans was also offered a Fellowship at the Cavendish Laboratory Cambridge by Prof. King, circa 1980. Colin Reid took up a post doctoral fellowship in Trinity College Dublin, part of the OxBridge system and in the Mass Spectroscopy Unit in Swansea, and for a short while was a teacher at Llandyfri College.

## HIGHER DOCTORATE

30) Scientiae Doctor (D. Sc.) of the University of Wales (1978) at the age of 27, the youngest D. Sc. under modern rules in Britain, Ireland and the Commonwealth. Modern rules impose a time interval between Ph .D. and D. Sc. The second youngest D. Sc. in history to Dr. Marie Stopes, who was allowed to submit the Thesis one year after Ph. D. under old rules. The Scientiae Doctor was founded in 1860 in the University of London, and is a distinction higher than full professor. The degree holder is addressed as "Doctor" and not "Professor".
